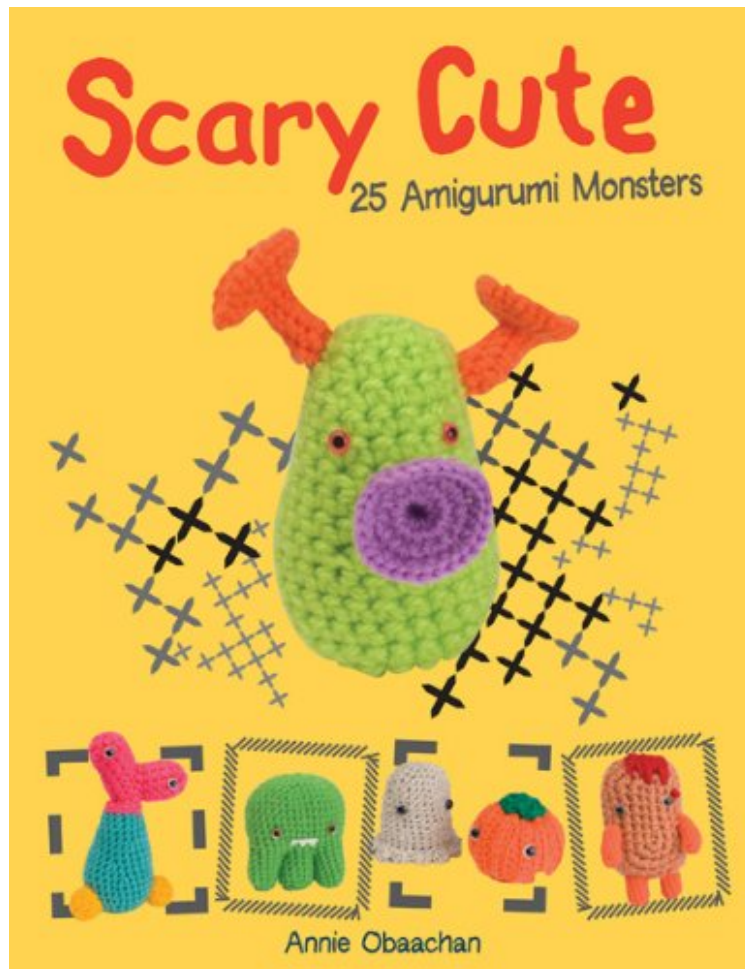

Note: I did crochet the pumpkin as a "test" before writing this review. The

instructions were easy to follow but omitted how to actually finish the pumpkin (the sewing together part). I figured it out on my own, though, and will post a picture here. I'll let you know when I attempt another monster if the directions are more thorough.

These monsters are small, and although they're just the least bit scary, they're mainly cute. That's because they are Amigurumi monsters! Amigurumi is a popular Japanese crochet method that uses the double-ring technique for making delightful miniature toy animals out of crochet yarn. This book concentrates on patterns for animals of the monster variety, presenting 25 original monster-making projects plus advice to readers on how they can design their own original Amigurumi animals. Author Annie Obaachan advises on yarns, crochet hooks, and other materials, and presents clear instructions for making: A Halloween Monster Collection of Ghosts and Pumpkins Purple Attack--a Miniature Octopus-like Monster Dinky Dinosaur Things with Wings . . . and many more Each of these funny little fellows averages four-to-six inches long.
