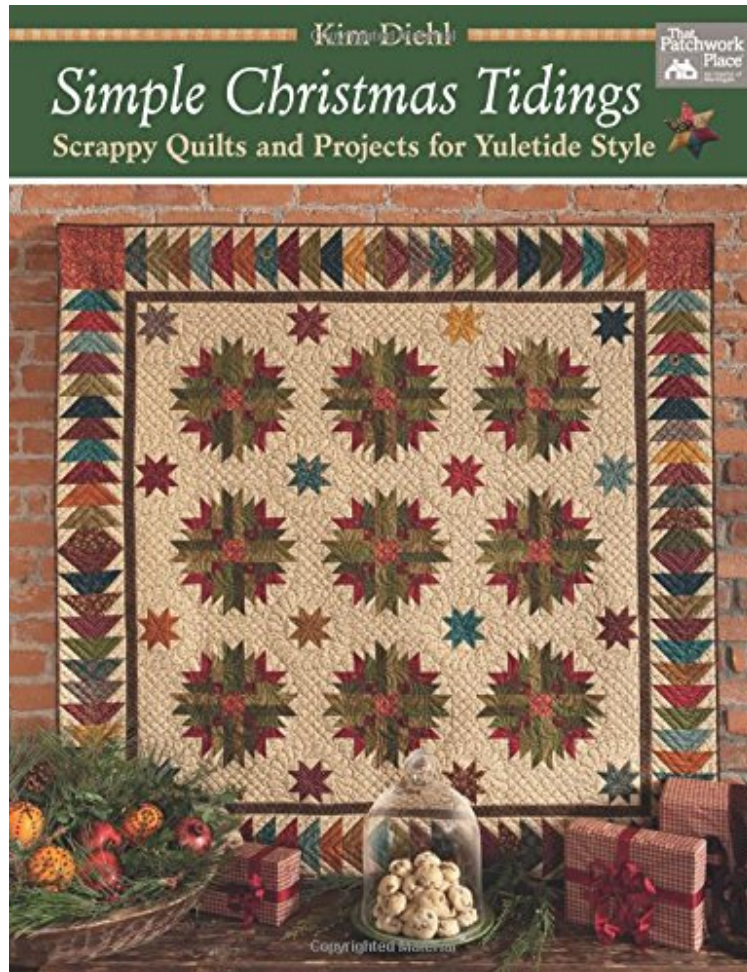

I love this book!By George-yThis book exceeds my expectations because it not only includes nice quilt projects but because it also gives us a glimpse of who Kim Diehl, the person, is through the additional non-quilting recipes and projects and their brief story like Raspberry Kiss Thumbprint Cookies (yummy!), Cinnamon Ornaments to hang on the tree, and Snow in a Jar (love this one too!).The book includes quilt-sized projects, a snowman pillow, several table toppers or wall hangings and a lot more. I especially like a 40.5" x

40.5" Holiday Hospitality Tree Skirt (which can simply be a table topper by not cutting/slicing it for a tree) that includes pomegranates and pineapple motifs along with stars. Since I live in Florida, the pineapple symbolism is very attractive for me and I plan to start this table topper soon for year round use. There's also some small projects like snowman, star, and wool penny tree ornaments. The nice part about the book is that nearly every project (okay, maybe not the Christmas stockings) is not exclusive to Christmas (or at least they don't have to be...just change the fabric). Some of the projects also include wool like for the snowmen. (Wool is really easy and forgiving to work with since it doesn't ravel.) Maybe I'm being anal but I really like the fact that Kim's Quilting Basics like how to use a rotary cutter to straighten the edge of a piece of fabric, how to cut something on the bias, how to chain piece, how to press a block seams, etc., are at the BACK of the book for reference...not like most books that put that basic information in the front. For this book, you open it up and immediately get pulled in and excited about the projects. I'm someone who reads nearly every word of a book so when the basics are at the beginning of the book, I find myself evaluating whether or not I agree with the author's method of doing a procedure before I even get a chance to look at the projects. (Although over time I'm learning to skip the basics at first and dive into the projects then go back and do my due diligence and read all the basics. You never know...there might be something in there that I never considered before.) I'm crazy over good Christmas-related books and they are often hard to find.
