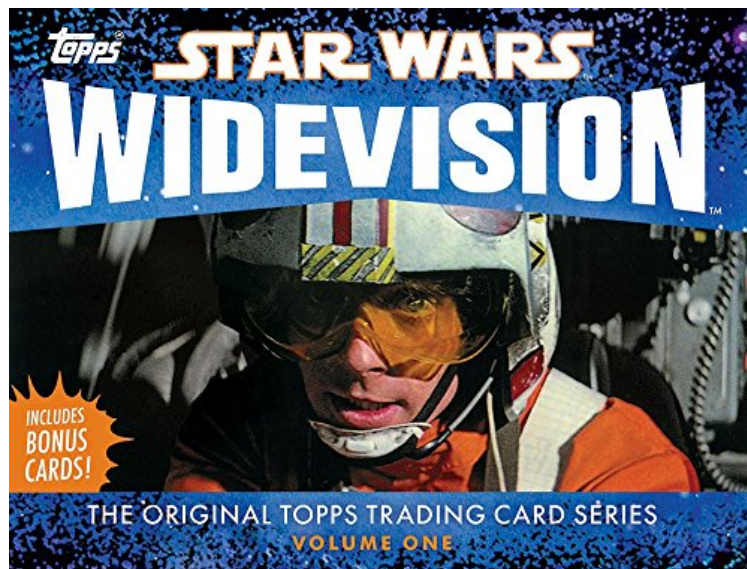

Now I understand if they were going for a straight repro of the cards...but...what's the point...these are books-at least use better tech which I'm sure is a standard for the publisher, and enlarge them...larger than actual size. On one page have a large version of card, and on opposite page an enlarged cardback. Not so difficult-Tho the page sizes are relatively small they could have gone a bit bigger. I have most of the books in this series, including Wacky Packages, but I pretty much feel the same about all of them. They also dropped the ball on Batman's 75th...missed opportunity. where's the book w/all those amazing 60's cards...between the TV show, and the cards w/that glorious Norm Saunders artwork...I'd want those more than all the other's.
