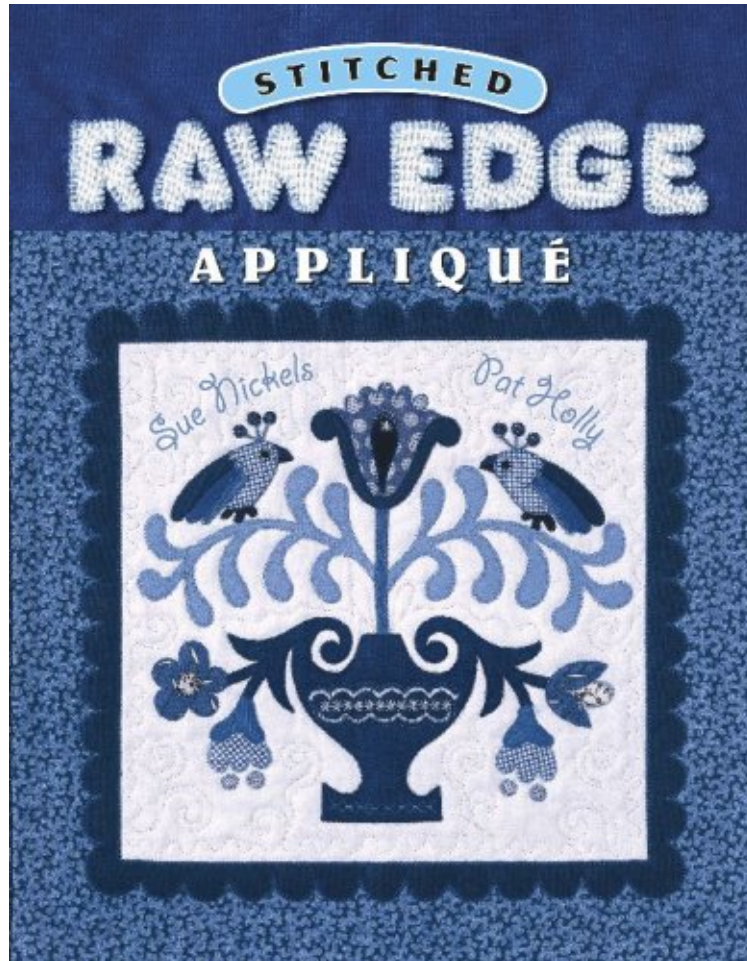

how easy it is to create beautiful finished quilt projects with their new fusing methods. Even fussy pieces have sharp points, neat edges, and no seam allowances to turn under. And best yet, the resulting quilts are soft and flexible unlike many quilts made with traditional fusing methods. These two masters of machine quilting show you tricks of the trade to make your own masterpiece. Even beginning appliquers will find this method accessible and easy to learn. The book is liberally laced with illustrations. Pats Pointers and Sue's Solutions provide handy hints to make the fusible applique even easier and more fun. A number of other techniques are served up to entice the quilter to enrich her quilts with simple embellishments, such as very narrow bias stems, couched thread details, and really tiny circles. Quilters learn to create their own embroidered background fabrics, embellished bindings, and looped edges, through five charming, fusible applique projects in the book.
