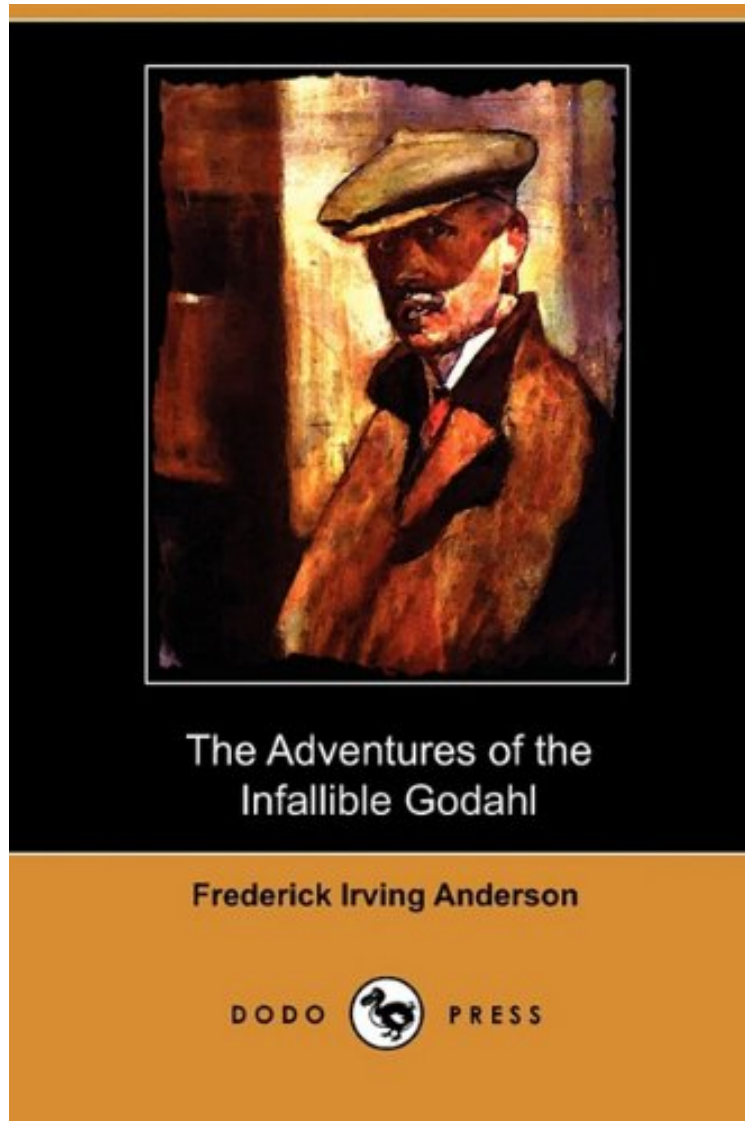

BreenThese tales of a master criminal were first published in 1914. Anderson is a remarkable stylist who brings to life America and especially New York in the early 20th century.

His plots may be far-fetched, but his writing and evocation of time and place are something special. The first story has a postmodern touch: Oliver Armiston, the fictional creator of Godahl, is introduced as a character, and the subsequent stories are presumably to be seen as examples of Armiston's fiction about Godahl. The second story (Blind Mans Buff) is a minor classic. The third (The Night of a Thousand Thieves) is remarkable in its exploration of character and mood. A 1907 vehicle (a Herkimer) is still on the road but considered an old car. Its estimated to be one of a hundred thousand vehicles in New York City and environs at the time. The story climaxes with an elaborate and audacious big caper but begins with a sympathetic portrait of a beat cop on wee-hours duty who dreams of going fishing the next day. The six stories bring to life a time more than a century ago when we had electricity, cars, sound recording, telephones, and motion pictures but hadn't yet experienced a World War. There is no ideal e-book edition of Godahl available. A more expensive and allegedly annotated edition has a better cover and may be easier to read because paragraph separation is clearer, but there are no annotations. I recommend the 99-cent version. Note that the rating is based solely on the literary interest, not the presentation.

Frederick Irving Anderson (1877-1947) was an American journalist and short story writer. He began publishing before World War I. He published two books on farming and only three works of fiction during his lifetime, leaving most of his stories uncollected in magazines. He has links to the Rogue school. Some of his early fiction deals with clever thieves. His works include: *The Adventures of the Infallible Godahl* (1914), *Electricity for the Farm* (1915), *The Notorious Sophie Lang* (1925) and *The Book of Murder* (1930).
