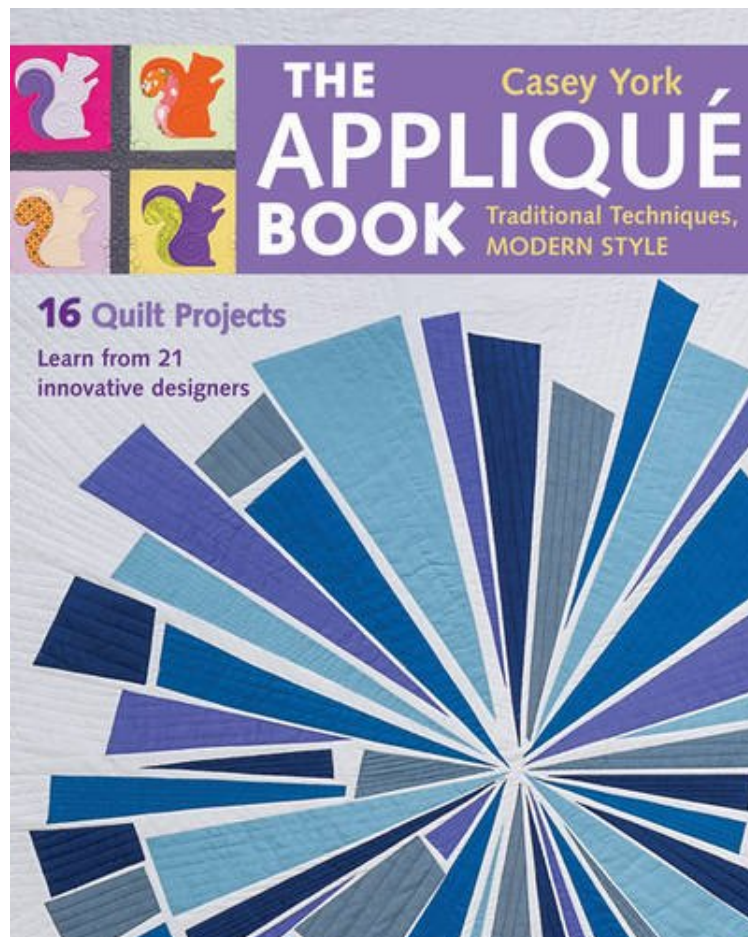

The more unusual areas are the free form and the bias tape appliqué. 'Shards' has free cut radiating long thin triangles on a white background. A bias tape quilt 'Paper Chains' has large loops falling down. Each section has contributions from different quilters plus some projects to make. All the quilters explain their methods well and some discuss their quilting designs.
