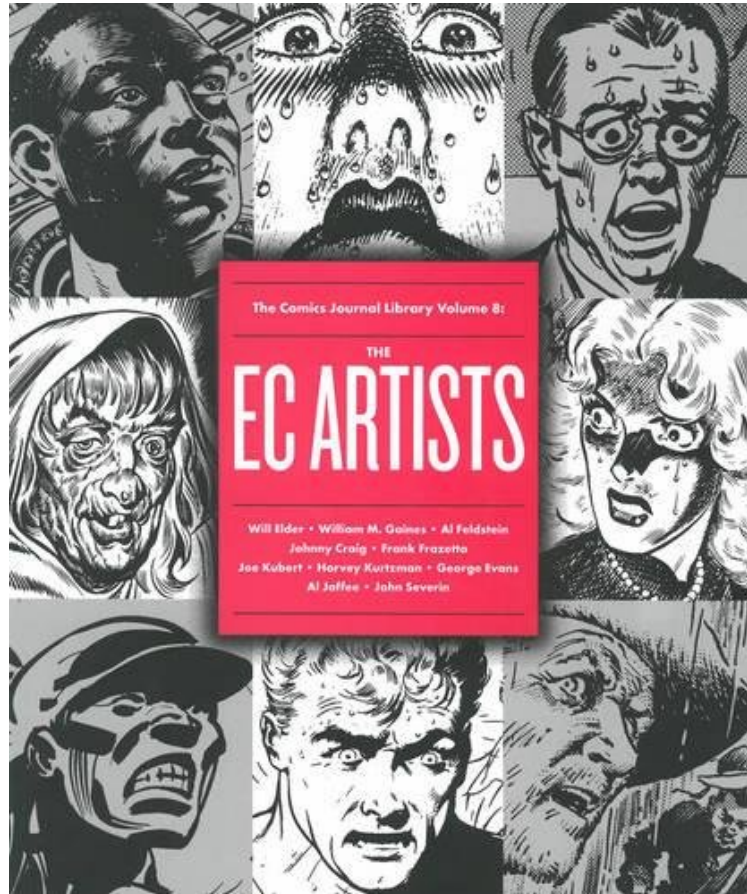

The interviews contained within range in length from massive to just a couple of pages and if you have any interest in EC Comics, most of your questions about everything as to how the comics were written, illustrated, distributed and sold will be answered. It's an excellent book on the nitty gritty of the whole operation and it's elucidated on a case by case basis from the perspective of those who were there from the beginning, middle and end of EC's Golden Age. And as a bonus, this book is only volume 1 with another volume on the way hopefully sooner

rather than later. Even if you're more inclined to being an admirer of art, this book has enough in the way of finely reproduced illustrations to make it worthwhile on that detail alone. It's a great supplement to Fantagraphics current series of EC reprints, as well as any other collections of EC material that has come before, whether it's the Library, Annuals, Classics, Archives, Portfolios, Artist Editions, single issues, East Coast reprints, Ballantine paperbacks, fanzines, histories or even the original issues in their virgin state. If you are a fan of EC you should have this book. Most of the contents are reprints of interviews from The Comics Journal and other sources, but there is also a lot of new material, and it's great to have all this stuff in one easy to access volume, or 2 volume set. 5 of 5 people found the following review helpful.
