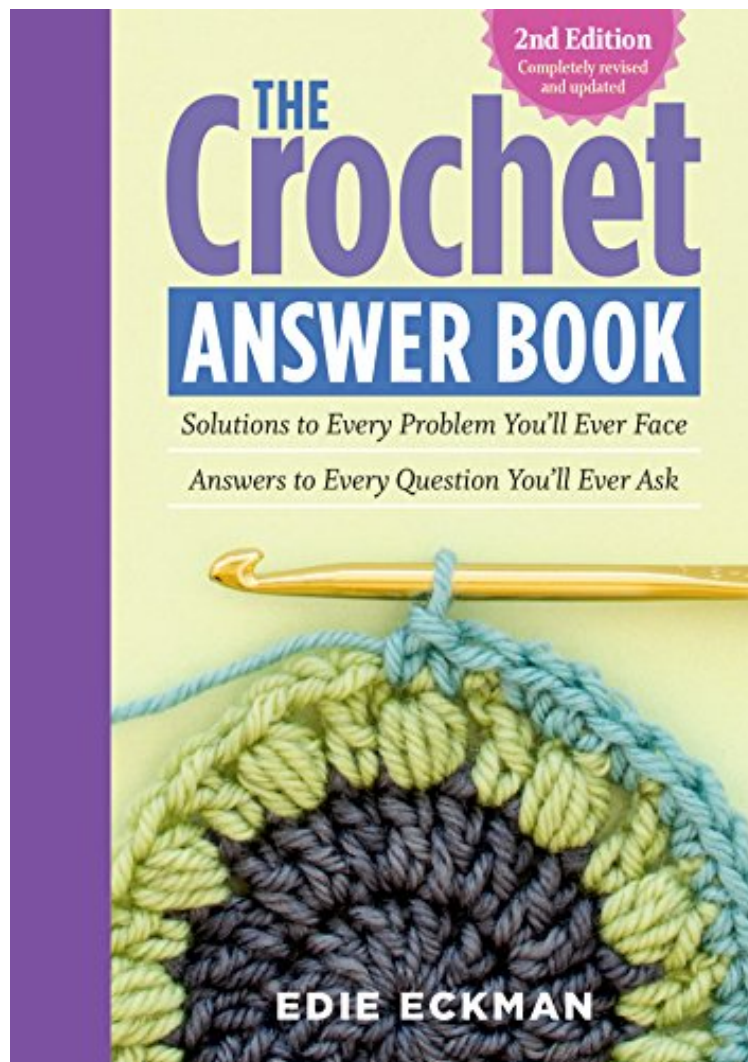

provided a temporary digital advance reader copy of the new edition (by the publisher via Netgalley). Once I had gone  
through it, I knew that I would (and did) pre-order the hard copy to have on hand at all times. There was enough  
update to the book - new yarns and techniques - that getting the second edition made complete sense.I honestly have  
not had a crochet question come up which is not addressed in this answer book. The illustrations are not great but the  
information is definitely sufficient to work through my issues. This is not a pattern book; it is a resource book to find  
answers to issues you never even knew that you had. While reading through it, I had many "Aha!" moments when I  
realized that I had been doing something in a less than optimal way.Whether for yourself or as a gift for someone you  
know who crochets, this book is a perfect additional to the crocheters bookcase. Though that is a misstatement - it will
