After that, this book is not very useful. There are many lovely, gorgeously arranged color photos featuring the Glorafilia designs. However, this 192 page book only contains four color needlepoint charts. The other designs have a strange type of pattern that you are supposed to trace onto the canvas. A traditional chart would be far more useful. Another problem is the section about stitching. There is a nice color photo featuring 25 different types of stitches, and the book is supposed to contain a set of cards demonstrating each stitch. Of course, the cards were lost long ago, so the reader has no way of learning how to do these stitches. It would have been better to print the instructions in the book instead of on loose cards. Overall, a pretty book, but not very helpful and a bit frustrating if you see a design that you really would like to stitch. Here are a few photos of the type of patterns provided with this book.

A guide to glorafilia needlepoint, which shows in practical detail, how to achieve the quality that has made this type of needlepoint famous. It describes the themes that have inspired the projects - classical motifs, Victorian florals, geometrics and oriental designs. These designs can then be used on cushions, pictures, stuffed animals, samplers and rugs. Projects can be approached at all levels of skill - simple for beginners but challenging enough to satisfy even an

experienced needleworker.
