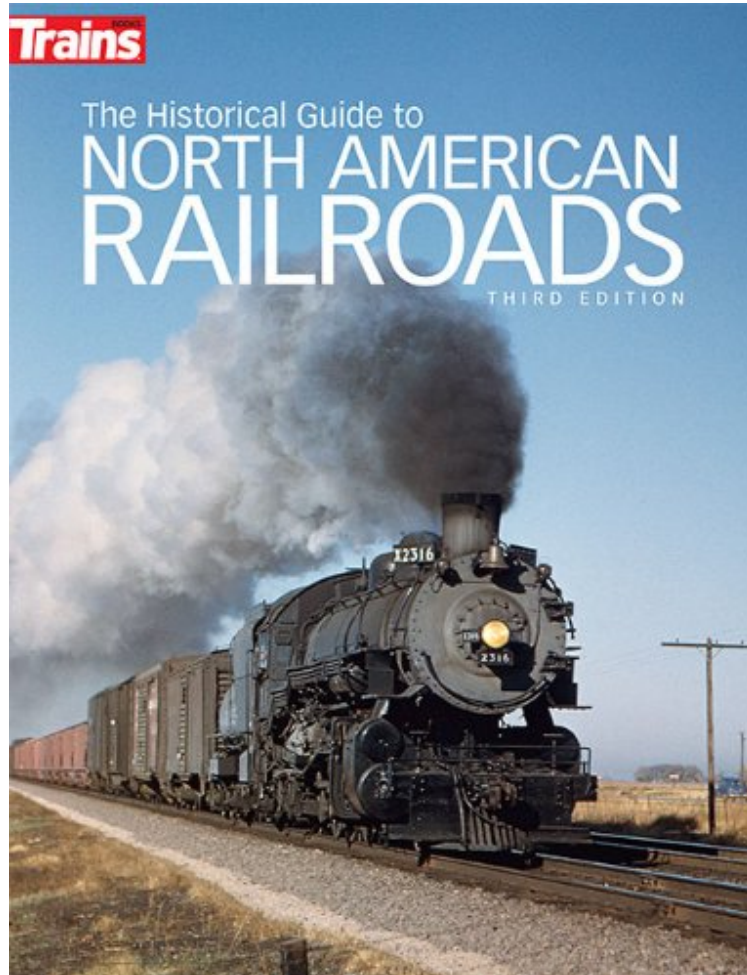

The photos are wonderful, the type easy to read, and the glossy pages make it feel like a much more expensive coffee table book.
