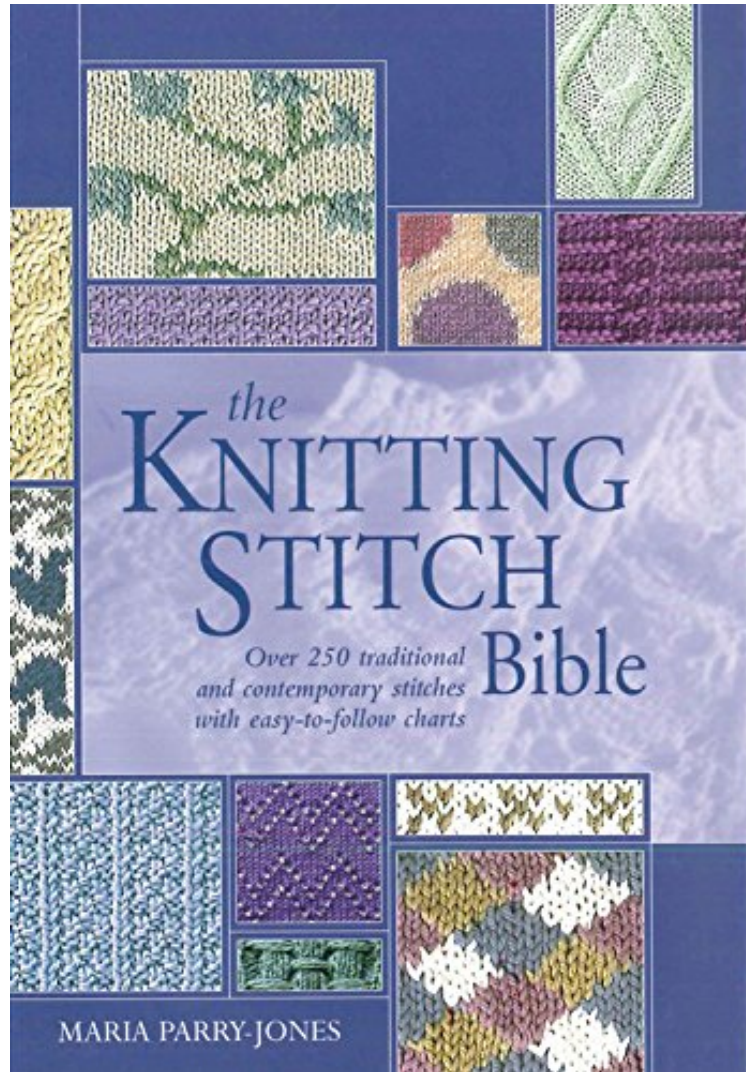

This book shows each design and then shows the chart for the pattern line by line. The descriptions of what each symbol is in the back of the book and is pretty clear when you write one out in long hand. I hadn't seen the chart system before but after working through a few of the easier designs I'm getting used to charts. I can see how doing a pattern in a chart can help you know what is wrong with your patten. I bought a baby book that I tried to make three of the patterns in it. I had to ripe out all three. If it was in a chart I could have seen that the descriptions in the book of the patterns had major errors in it.

This hardcover book with internal wire-o binding is 6.5in x 8in is a perfect size for readers to keep handy and reference often. The stylish design of the crafting Bible series, along with the interior photographs, illustrations and diagrams, make the learning process simple and fun for beginners. Knitting knowledge has traditionally been passed on directly from one generation to another. In recent years, a renewed interest in knitting has blossomed and many young knitters are discovering that this craft can be used to create very fashionable garments. Knitting can become a very enjoyable activity which, as well as being useful and highly creative, has an extraordinarily therapeutic value. The Knitting Stitch Bible contains a broad range of designs in seven different types of knitting, and the book is structured to meet the needs of all knitters, from beginners to the more accomplished. The Knitting Stitch Bible is a comprehensive gallery of more than 250 stitches ranging from the easiest purl stitch to the most complex intarsia pattern. Yarns, needles, ball bands, and other equipment are explained in detail, with guided instructions on purchasing. Stitches like the knit and purl, rib, cable, bobble, lace, fair isle, and intarsia stitches are all explained with photographs and charts to guide knitters of all levels. Abbreviations are defined in the index, and chart symbols are explained in detail to make it easy to follow along.
